# The Great Fiji Shark Count

## Inshore Reefs

### Habitat Types:

<b>1. High Profile Reef:</b>	Most coral heads rise four or more feet off the bottom.
<b>2. Low Profile Reef:</b>	Most coral heads average less than four feet off the bottom.
<b>3. Sloping Dropoff:</b>	Angled slope dropping into open water.
<b>4. Wall:</b>	Sheer drop-off of over 25 feet that faces open water.
<b>5. Ledge:</b>	Single or few sharp drops (like steps) of three or more feet may or may not face open water
<b>6. Grass:</b>	Sea grasses are the predominant feature
<b>7. Sand:</b>	Mostly sand bottom
<b>8. Rubble:</b>	Broken dead coral, rock, boulders over most of the bottom.
<b>9. Artificial:</b>	Ship wrecks, dumped debris or other artificial habitats.
<b>10. Open Water:</b>	Deep water where the bottom is not visible.
<b>11. Passage:</b>	Channel between open ocean and inner reef, steep sided
