Inshore Reefs

Habitat Types:

1.	High Profile Reef:	Most coral heads rise four or more feet off the bottom.
2.	Low Profile Reef:	Most coral heads average less than four feet off the bottom.
3.	Sloping Dropoff:	Angled slope dropping into open water.
4.	Wall:	Sheer drop-off of over 25 feet that faces open water.
5.	Ledge:	Single or few sharp drops (like steps) of three or more feet
		may or may not face open water
6.	Grass:	Sea grasses are the predominant feature
7.	Sand:	Mostly sand bottom
8.	Rubble:	Broken dead coral, rock, boulders over most of the bottom.
9.	Artificial:	Ship wrecks, dumped debris or other artificial habitats.
10.	Open Water:	Deep water where the bottom is not visible.
11.	Passage:	Channel between open ocean and inner reef, steep sided
